3. Who were Masters and Johnson and what was their claim to fame relative to research in human sexuality? When did they publish their work? Did their work only focus on males or females?
4. Briefly describe at least 4 different results of the work done by Masters and Johnson.
5. What was the Hite Report and what were some basic results of this report? When was it published? Did it focus on males or females? Was there more than one Hite Report?
6. When was the Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality established? What is the basic mission of this scientific organization?
7. When did Richard Freiherr von Krafft-Ebing publish the *Psychopathia Sexualis* (which is the work that is considered to have established sexology as a scientific discipline)?□□□□
8. Who published *Sexual Inversion* (*Das Konträre Geschlechtsgefühl*) and when did they publish it? This researcher was one of the first sexologists who did not regard homosexuality as a disease, immoral, or a crime.
